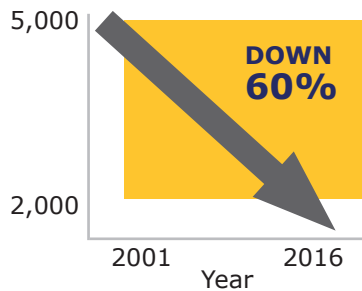

Three-quarters of New Jersey's infants and toddlers **do not have access** to high-quality **child care**



70% of poor children in regular, non-parental care receive care **within three miles of their home**
